



CVHEC Guaranteed Transfer Admission Agreement FAQ & Instructions

What is the CVHEC Guaranteed Transfer Admission Agreement?

A Transfer Admission Agreement (TAA) is a formal, written agreement that outlines the courses you must complete and grade point average (GPA) you must earn before transferring from a community college to Pacific.

The Central Valley Higher Education Consortium (CVHEC) Transfer Admission Agreement guarantees, in advance, admission to The University of the Pacific for a student from the participating Central Valley Junior and Community colleges. In order to be eligible a student must meet the following requirements:

- Complete and receive a CVHEC A.A. degree and Sixty (60) semester units or Ninety (90) quarter units from one of the participating community colleges with a transferable GPA of either a 2.8 (for most majors) or a 3.0 (for more competitive majors).
- After the TAA is written, it must be signed by you, your counselor and a Pacific representative. These signatures guarantee that you will be admitted to the University of the Pacific in the major specified, for the specified term, provided you complete the terms of the agreement.
- Fill out the CVHEC Guaranteed TAA form by February 1st to enroll in the next Fall term or by July 1st to enroll in the next Spring term you plan to attend and mail it to the Office of Admission

Please note, the maximum number of transferable units accepted, by Pacific, from a two-year school is seventy (70) semester units or one hundred and five (105) quarter units.

Who are the Participating Central Valley Junior and Community Colleges?

Only students who are transferring from the following institutions are eligible for the CVHEC TAA:

How Do You Arrange for a CVHEC TAA?

CVHEC TAA's are available from our website for the fall and spring terms on our website at www.pacific.edu/transfer or at go.pacific.edu/taa Once your community college counselor determines that you are eligible to transfer to The University of the Pacific and that you meet the TAA criteria for your major, he or she will begin the process.

Do I Have to File an Application for Admission?

In addition to filing a CVHEC TAA you must apply to University of the Pacific by submitting a completed Undergraduate Transfer Application for admission. This can be found free online at www.pacific.edu/transfer by the transfer application deadline of the term for which you are applying: February 15th for Fall entrance or July 1st for Spring entrance.

A completed Undergraduate Transfer Application includes:

- Completed Transfer Application for Admission
- Official transcripts from all institutions you have attended.
- Academic Letter of Recommendation
- Personal Statement
